

# Correct way to separate and dispose of garbage

※The name column on the designated bag must be filled in using the designated district markings (name, number, etc.).  
 ※As a general rule, bags should be placed at the designated collection point for each district between 7:00 and 8:00 a.m. on the morning of the day they are to be disposed of.
